THE PAPER MONEY OF ARGENTINA 1861 - 1872 PRIVATE AND PROVINCIAL ISSUES

BANCO DEL ROSARIO

The Banco del Rosario was established by law of 26 June 1865, assented to by the legislature on 16 August 1865. The initial capital was to be one million pesos divided into ten thousand shares at 100 pesos each. By contract of July 19, 1866, it will become the bank of the provincial government which will have a current account in pesos fuertes with a credit limit of 25,000 \$F. On September13, the Banco Argentino will take over the assets and liabilities of this bank, which has been important despite its ephemeral existence.

The Banco del Rosario will launch a single issue of Bolivian silver notes, all without printing on the reverse, comprising four values.

BANCO ARGENTINO

The Banco Argentino, which opened its counters in Rosario on September1, 1866, was the first attempt to create a bank at a national level, with branches both in the capital and in the important cities of the interior. Based on the foundations of the Banco del Rosario by grouping José M. Mendez, Soaje Hnos., Julio Fragueiro, etc., its launch was strongly encouraged by General Urquiza, who acquired a thousand shares at one hundred pesos fuertes each, the equivalent of a good half a million gold francs or one hundred thousand dollars at the time. The headquarters of the bank was established in Rosario with branches in Santa Fé, Córdoba, Paraná, Concordia with its port on the Uruguay River, Gualeguay and Buenos Aires, and agencies for the exchange of banknotes in Diamante, Villa Urquiza on the shores of Paraná, as well as in Victoria and Nogoyá, in the interior of the province.

Three serious blows were inflicted on banco Argentino : on the one hand, the assassination on 11 April 1870 of its main shareholder Urquiza ; on the other hand, the beginning of operations, on November 4, 1873, of the new Banco Nacional which opened branches in all the cities where subsidiaries of the Banco Argentino existed and in all the provincial capitals; the fatal blow that led to its closure at the end of 1876 was the international crisis that led to a rise in gold, the result of which was the inconvertibility of paper money. The fact that almost all the banknotes we see today are unissued copies seems to indicate that almost all of the issue was repaid when the bank was liquidated.

To simplify matters, we mention the notes issued by the branches with overprints on the Rosario head office after the respective notes without overprint. From 1871, these issues will be distinguished by the color of the paper and will be grouped by branch.

FIRST ISSUE

UNIFACE NOTES PAYABLE IN BOLIVIAN SILVER IN CASH, PRINTED AT LIT. A. LARSCH, FLORIDA 103, BUENOS AIRES

Initially, the bank seems to have continued to put into circulation the balance of the Banco del Rosario notes, before a provisional issue of own notes using elements of the plates of its predecessor was available, supplemented by new denominations.







The second, on the other hand, applied twice diagonally or vertically in black ink on the obverse, mentions only the name of the branch in capital characters 6 mm high.

1st ISSUE IN PESOS FUERTES

F. Chao (h) mentions under *BA-2E-1 (?)* the possibility of the existence of a 5 pesos fuertes note based on an 1867 balance sheet showing that the bank had 2399 5-\$F notes in circulation. However, no copies are known at this time.

3rd ISSUE – NOTES PRINTED BY THE AMERICAN BANK NOTE COMPANY

ALL NOTES ARE PAYABLE IN BOLIVIAN SILVER OR ITS EQUIVALENT IN LEGAL COINAGE.

For the issuance of the final notes, the bank resumed negotiations with the American Bank Note Company begun by the Banco del Rosario, by asking in addition a denomination of 4 Reales, essential for daily transactions. This issue has been the subject of four successive orders :

- 1. 07/1866 : 1, 10 and 50 \$ moneda boliviana, 50 centavos, 2 and 20 \$F. Paper of different color for each value. Rosario is engraved on the plate, the date, series letter and number being added in typography ;
- 2. 10/1866: 4 Reales and 5 \$ moneda boliviana. Details as for the first order;
- 3. 02/1872 : 5 and 10 \$ moneda boliviana. White paper with colored background varying according to the value. Details as for previous orders;
- 4. 12/1872: 4 Reales and 1 \$ moneda boliviana. Details as the February 1872 order.

The compilation of the printed banknotes was made based on the works of Ricardo M. Magan and Fernando Chao (h), as well as the SCWPM catalogue. For classification, issues from 1866 to 1868 were classified by ascending values, with notes without overprint first, and then those with branch overprints in alphabetical order of the latter. The archives of the ABNC^o give the details of the various impressions, and even if some of these notes have not yet been found, it is nevertheless more than likely that they were put into circulation. Recall that 20 Bolivian pesos or 20 pesos fuertes were about the equivalent of 20 US-dollars, and that very few people owning such notes at the time could have put them aside: it was more interesting to spend them !

All these notes have the same promise of payment : *The Banco Argentino will pay on sight and at the bearer ... Bolivian money or its equivalent* in legal tender. As for the dates and series, they change regularly, and the system will be specified for each denomination. Here is a correlative table of the serial letters and dates applicable to all notes issued before 1873, whether denominated in Bolivian pesos or strong pesos:

As there were still large quantities of unissued notes from the various branches of this bank, we find some that were signed a posteriori by Peter, Paul or John, probably in order to increase their attractiveness and market value! Look at the serial numbers of the two banknotes below with the same date and series: the copy with the lower number is an unsigned remainder, while the other is signed!! However, it cannot be ruled out that the notes were not issued in numerical order, although this is unlikely. Caveat emptor !



As a rule, the notes offered on the market are unsigned remainders. Authentic authorized notes are very hard to get.





According to the printer, the blue paper was only used for the July, 1866 order, up to K. The serial letter is placed under the number 1 of the background at the right, the year above this same number. From series L, the letter is placed above the 1 and the year after the month, on the left below "Rosario". However, some series from letter L and beyond are printed on blue paper and not on white paper with a blue colored background (look at series Y below). Some indications are therefore to be checked.





Signed notes should be considered with suspicion. Thus, the fact that the banknote below, No. 24500, is signed while No. 3163 is not, is suspicious, because at the time they were in principle put into circulation in numerical order, as they appeared in the registers. Be careful !

For those who would give the benefit of the doubt, the same signature appears on a 20 pesos note, issued in 1873, but this time by the Córdoba branch. 

The denomination of a *peso fuerte* mentioned under PS-1467 and PS-1531 does not exist, nor do those of 5 and 10 \$F (PS-1545 for example). It is very likely that the choice of denominations was made at the time in such a way to avoid confusion with the notes payable in Bolivian pesos and those payable in *pesos fuertes*.


