At the time, the province of Santa Fé was backward and poor, with almost four out of five illiterate inhabitants and more than three-quarters of the population living miserably in ranchos made of straw and raw bricks. Power was held there by the big landowners. Trade was mainly present in Rosario which did not even have 25,000 inhabitants in 1870 for 90,000 inhabitants throughout the province.

### BANCO COMERCIAL DE SANTA FÉ 1867 – 1869

As a result of a long-standing project of some members of the Santa Fé ruling class, including Pedro Funes, Argüello Hermanos and De la Serna y Cía among others, strongly encouraged by General Justo José de Urquiza, the Banco Comercial de Santa Féwas created on May 1, 1867, after the closure of Banco Mauá as an independent bank. As a government financier, he could issue banknotes payable on sight to the bearer, from 5 centavos fuertes and 1/2 real boliviano, notes that would be accepted in payment at all counters of the administration. The initial capital was 500,000 \$F, divided into 2000 shares at 250 \$F each. The bank establishes branches in the cities of Santa Fé, Victoria and Córdoba.

On September 30, 1868, following disagreements between Urquiza and the leaders of Santa Fé, the government of Entre Ríos decided to close all branches in the province, claiming the impossibility "to verify the conversion of the notes". The decline of the bank continued until the end of the year, ending with its closure in mid-1869.



This note of 20 pesos moneda boliviana, cataloged at Chao under BC-2E-1, would have been issued on October 28, 1867, according to a notice published in the press. However, no specimens nor issued note have been seen to date.

#### ISSUE OF JANUARY 2, 1869, IN PESOS PLATA BOLIVIANA

Notes printed in June 1868 by American Bank Note Co.

According to the printer, the bank cancelled its order in November 1868, which seems logical from the moment when the closure of the branch offices in the province of Entre Ríos had already been decided by the provincial government at the end of September 1868. The notes were incinerated ten years later, according to a certificate of incineration issued on September 14, 1878, in Buenos Aires by the United States Consul, E. L. Baker. Thus, none of these notes circulated officially. However, there are unsigned notes with strong traces of circulation: remember that nothing is easyer than trying to deceive someone by fraudulently put into circulation banknotes "saved" from incineration, especially in circumstances where many different notes were in circulation.



## BANCO DEL ROSARIO DE SANTA FÉ 1865

# BANCO (DEL) ROSARIO DE SANTA FÉ 1869-

The creation project is from July 27, 1869, but it is on January 1 (!), 1870, that this bank opened its counters to the public. At that time, only the Banco de Londres and the Banco Argentino remained in Rosario, and the city experienced a real estate boom. The bank enjoyed the support of the large landowners in the region with a planned capital of one million pesos fuertes. It granted an annual interest of 12% and had a large transfer service with South-West Europe. However, the real estate bubble deflated and debates for or against the bank weakened its position to the point that it had to cease operations on November 23, after barely eleven months of activity.

The notes were numbered in red, blue or black (depending on Chao) or brown (according to Bauman).

Note as a curiosity in the red background printing the letter D, which usually indicates the number 500 in Roman numerals. It can be assumed that here was meant 10 (first letter of the word DIEZ), while the Roman letter corresponding to this value is X, as indicated in the medallions on either side of the word DIEZ.

## CRÉDITO TERRITORIAL DE SANTA FÉ 1870 - 1873

Authorized by law of September 28, 1869, this bank issued notes to be paid in Bolivian silver pesos from January 15, 1870. It had been created by local landowners with the aim of increasing the number of owners and the population of the territory. After rumors published in the press, the shareholders had to call on the holders of their notes to present them at their counters within three months for reimbursement (La Época of 24 April 1873).


